GLOBAL IMPACT OVERVIEW

In Ramadan 2025, your support helped us reach 359,564 people with life-saving aid across Palestine, Syria, Yemen, Pakistan, Lebanon, Jordan, Iraq, and the UK. Our mission was to protect the most vulnerable, meet their basic needs, and transform lives.

Together, we turned your vital donations into more than 185,000 hot meals and 70,000 food parcels, delivering them with dignity to families affected by conflict, natural disasters, and poverty.





FOOD PARCELS

We distributed more than 70,000 food parcels, ensuring hundreds of thousands received nutritious food and sustenance throughout the holy month. Each parcel contains locally sourced ingredients, aligning with cultural needs.



SHELTER

In Gaza, we opened Hope Camp IV, providing emergency shelter for 6,000 displaced Palestinians. The camp features a kitchen, wash facilities, and communal areas for children.

HEALTH CARE

Our teams in Gaza delivered urgent medical aid to 15,000 people, and our mobile clinics in Pakistan performed cataract surgeries, restoring sight to children.



FITRANA

We distributed your Fitrana to over 11,000 people who needed it most, ensuring that all could enjoy the blessings of Eid-ul-Fitr.



HOT MEALS

We served 185,000 life-saving hot meals, allowing families to break their fasts with dignity and respect.



EID GIFTS

During Eid al-Fitr, we delivered Eid gifts to more than 1,600 children in communities struggling with poverty.



FLATBREADS

Our community bakeries distributed 550,000 fresh flatbreads during Ramadan.





LIFE-SAVING AID IN GAZA

Over 50,000 Palestinians, mostly women and children, have been killed in the Israel-Gaza war since October 2023. Over 110,453 people have been injured, and at least 10,000 are still missing. The entire population of Gaza, over 2.1 million people, is in urgent need of humanitarian assistance.


Throughout the sacred month of Ramadan, our teams have faced dangerous conditions to provide essential support to communities in crisis. Action For Humanity has stayed on the ground in Gaza, despite the persistent blockade on humanitarian aid, offering critical medical assistance to 15,000 people and

delivering over 73,000 life-saving meals to those in dire need.

Thanks to your support, we expanded our flagship community initiative in Gaza, opening Hope Camp IV in 2025. These sanctuaries now offer shelter to nearly 6,000 displaced Palestinians, complete with kitchens, wash facilities, and safe communal spaces for children to simply be children.

Through our Extend Your Table initiative, we also launched the Family Twinning project in Gaza and Syria - a people-centred approach to aid that directly empowers families to rebuild their lives with dignity and respect.





A BREAKTHROUGH YEAR IN SYRIA

Millions of Syria's children have grown up knowing nothing but conflict. Even before the escalation of fighting in 2024, a protracted war, economic decline, disease outbreaks, mass displacement, and shattered infrastructure had left millions of people in need of urgent humanitarian assistance.

Throughout Ramadan, we focused our efforts on providing hot meals, food parcels, and medical aid to the millions of displaced families in Syria. For the first time in 14 years, our Ramadan response in Syria extended from northern Aleppo and Idlib all the way down to Damascus.

We have opened several offices in the newly liberated regions to expand our ground operations and increase our impact.

Action For Humanity is taking a crucial first step to rehabilitate and repair damaged houses in the newly liberated areas of Syria. This effort aims to facilitate the return of our people to their homeland, bringing an end to their generation-long journey of displacement and misery.

COMFORT AMID CONFLICT IN YEMEN

After a decade of war, Yemen faces one of the world's most severe humanitarian crises. Around 4.5 million people—14% of the population—are internally displaced, and over 3 million have been forced to flee the country. Seventeen million Yemenis are experiencing acute food insecurity, including 5 million people on the brink of famine.

In Yemen, we distributed food parcels, hot meals, and flatbreads to hundreds of thousands of foodinsecure families, offering comfort amid conflict this Ramadan.

Thanks to your incredible support, we were able to deliver over 15,000 food parcels - enough to feed 75,000 people - along with 350,000 breads and 32,000 hot meals in Yemen, each one a lifeline, a comfort, and a reminder that generosity travels far.

LEBANON - A COMMUNITY IN ACTION

Lebanon is currently experiencing severe economic and humanitarian crises. Widespread poverty, economic downturns, and the ongoing conflict have resulted in significant casualties and displacement. Over 80% of the population lives in poverty, and nearly 36% are in extreme poverty.

In Lebanon, we proudly launched our Community Kitchen and Bakery, a vibrant hub of nourishment and hope, where 28,000 hot meals were lovingly prepared and served throughout the sacred month of Ramadan.

Thanks to your support, we distributed 200,000 fresh flatbreads, 28,000 nourishing hot meals and over 2,000 WASH kits packed with essential hygiene and sanitary products.

These efforts ensured that thousands could break their fast and maintain their health and dignity during the most spiritually significant time of the year.

TRANSFORMING LIVES IN PAKISTAN


In recent years, Pakistan has experienced a wave of unprecedented floods, and the effects of which are still being felt today. Historic floods submerged one-third of the country, affecting 33 million people, with half of them children. Thousands of people died, over 7.9 million people were displaced, and 1.3 million homes were damaged.

This Ramadan, your generosity brought hope and healing to over 13,000 people in Pakistan. Your thoughtful Eid gifts lit up the faces of more than 1,000 children, spreading joy during the most special time of year.

With your support, we constructed six water wells, bringing clean water and improved sanitation to 5,000 people, transforming daily life with every drop. And in perhaps the most profound gift of all, children received life-changing cataract surgeries, restoring their sight and opening their eyes to a brighter future.







DELIVERING ESSENTIAL AID TO JORDAN & IRAQ

Jordan has one of the highest numbers of refugees per capita in the world, and welcomes millions of people from countries including Syria, Iraq, Yemen and Palestine, who are now living in camps and host communities.

In Jordan, your generosity during Ramadan made a meaningful impact across communities. We distributed 158 Eid gifts, bringing joy to children and families during the festive season, while 1,000 food parcels and 500 hot meals provided essential nourishment to those in need. Thanks to your Zakat, 1,900 people received vital support, reminding them that they were not forgotten.

And in Iraq, we delivered more than 2,200 food parcels, helping vulnerable families break their fast with dignity and respect.

OUR UK DOMESTIC PROJECTS

This Ramadan, we supported asylum seekers and refugees across Greater Manchester, many experiencing their first Ramadan away from home, including women and children affected by domestic abuse.

Through our Iftar and Suhoor distributions, we provided 2,500 hot meals and Suhoor packs with essentials like bread, honey, dates, and beans, offering nourishment and a sense of dignity. In partnership with Manchester Women's Aid and The Pankhurst Trust, we ensured women in refuge with no recourse to public funds could observe Ramadan with the care and respect they deserve.

The Manchester Museum Community Iftar brought together 400 guests, including unaccompanied young asylum seekers, for an interfaith celebration of Ramadan. Hosted by Action for Humanity in collaboration with Manchester City Council and Chancellor Nazir Afzal, the event provided a meal and a safe, welcoming space where young people felt valued and connected to a wider community.
